We work to influence the criminal justice and child protection systems to ensure that they meet the needs of vulnerable survivors

We build a stable and sustainable organisation that is accessible, transparent and accountable

2022 in Review

We hosted a National Child Safety Summit, bringing together experts across the statutory, academic and NGO sectors to explore the barriers to reducing the incidence of child sexual abuse

We published research, "The Victim's Experience in Focus", exploring survivors' experiences of engaging with the criminal justice system
