One in Four offers a comprehensive, wrap-around service model designed to support survivors of child sexual abuse.

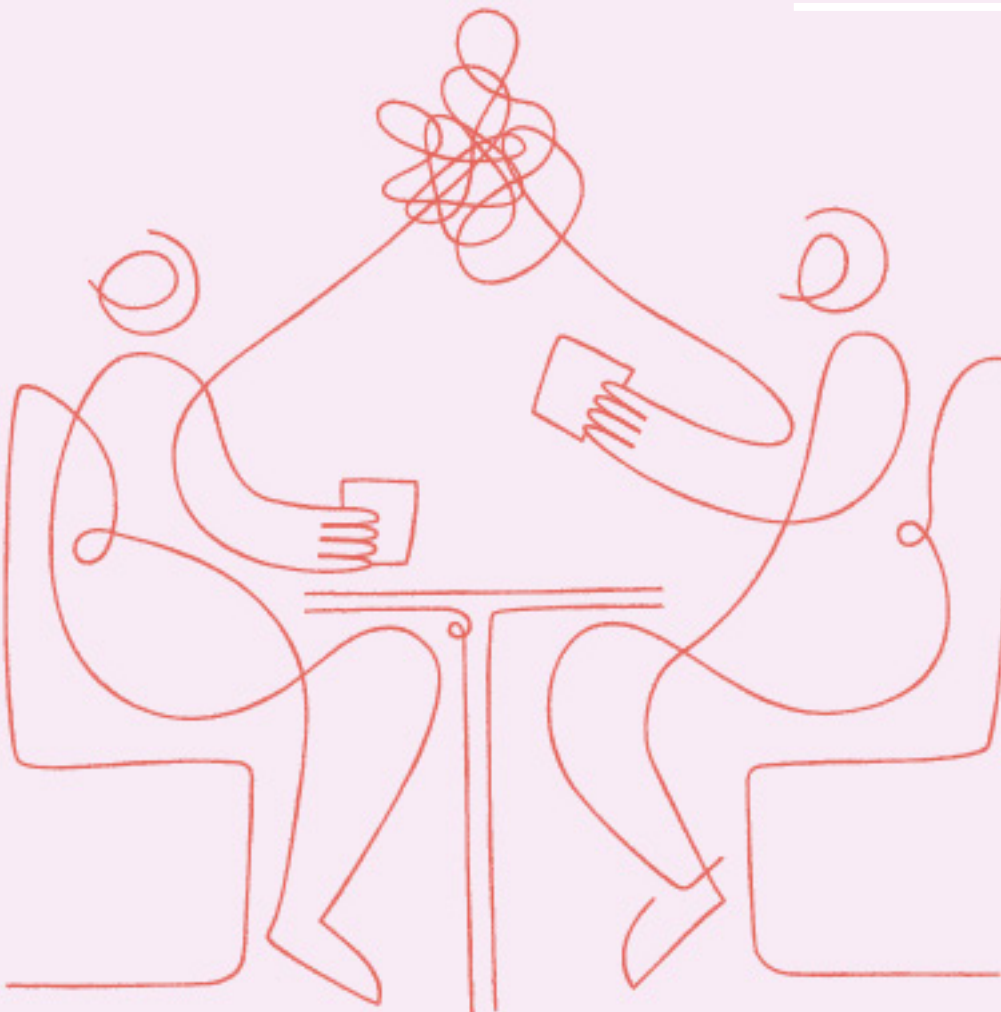
Our approach integrates multiple services to ensure our response to the impact is coordinated and addresses diverse needs.

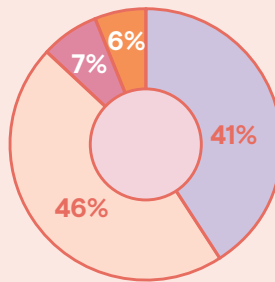

Collaborating/ Influencing



CEO Maeve Lewis served as co-chair of the newly established Dept. of Justice Victims' Forum from November 2022 to December 2023, made up of governmental agencies and approximately 70 NGOs sharing knowledge, expertise and potential issues.

Resulting from the National Child Safety Summit One in Four hosted in 2022, One in Four is in the preliminary stages of establishing a cross-sectoral National Child Safety Taskforce and commissioning an Attitudinal Research Study with support from the Community Foundation.

We worked with other NGOs and the psychotherapy professional bodies to address difficulties for adult survivors engaging with the Tusla Child Abuse Substantiation Procedure.

We engaged with the Dept of Education regarding the Scoping Inquiry into sexual abuse in religious order-run schools.

One in Four participated in the Children's Rights Alliance's member consultation on the Coimisiún na Meán Online Safety Codes.

CEO Maeve Lewis gave evidence to the Joint Oireachtas Committee on Education regarding the Education (Supports for Survivors of Residential Abuse) Bill 2023.

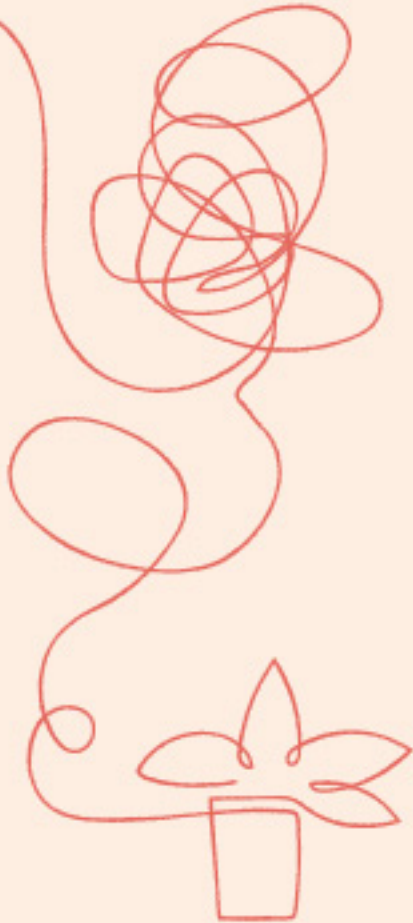
We are fully compliant with the Charities Regulator Governance Code.

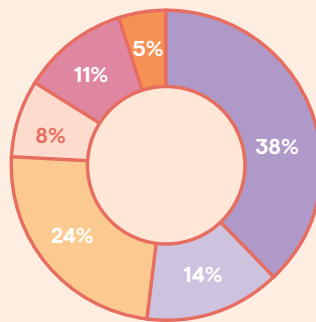

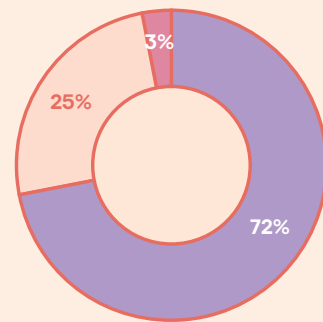


Operational Funding

Operational Expenditure

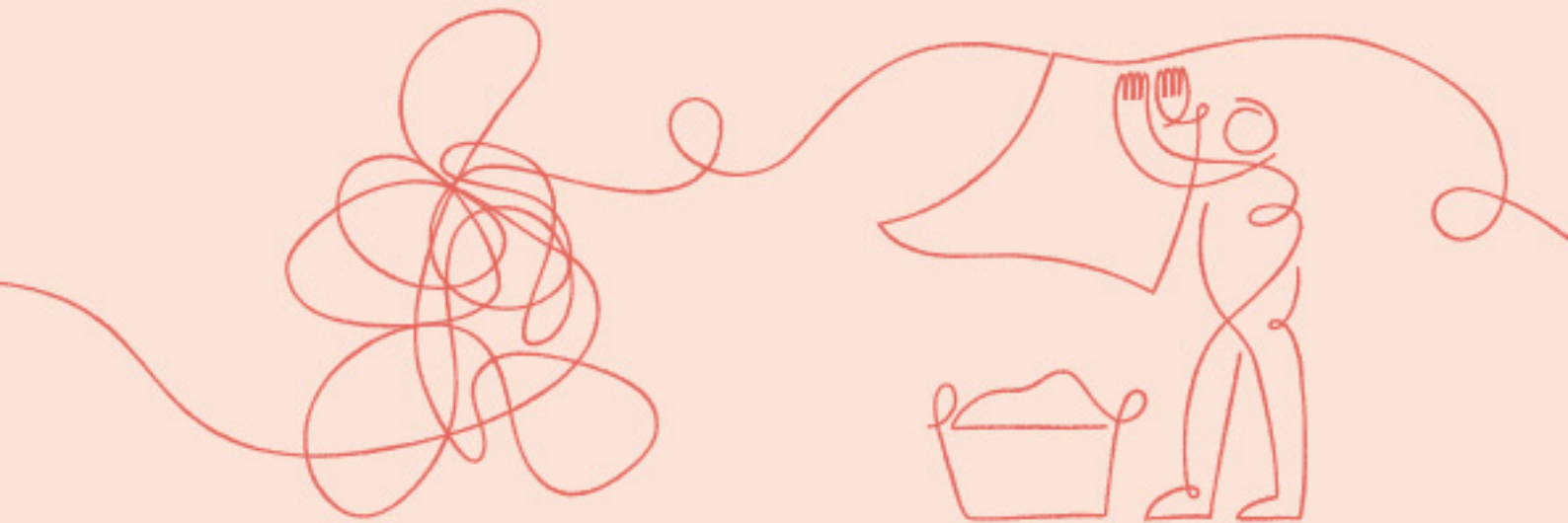
